Logan City Special School will receive**

\$201,956*

This funding will be used to

- Increase the proportion of students achieving Individual Achievement Scales (IAS) level improvements in literacy - 70% Responding to Intentional Phase students (Pre-Prep) move two IAS levels, 75% Prep and above level students move one IAS level in Interpreting Texts by the end of 2022.
- 70% students on PM Benchmark 3 and above move up one level by the end of 2022.
- Continue supporting pedagogy in Communication through in class coaching and mentoring.
- Increase school wide strategies and practices for ensuring all students have a voice as part of improvements outlined in the LCSS Communication Policy.
- Modify learning spaces to enhance teaching and learning.

Our initiatives include

- Support the professional development of staff in key areas of literacy, numeracy and augmented and assisted communication technologies.
- Ensure staff are supported with quality coaching and mentoring.
- Engage a Speech Language Pathologist to coach and advise staff & students on best practice with Communication skills
- Enhance infrastructure to support teaching and learning
